



Additional information on how to claim reimbursement/support for publication fees

A: Researchers applying to a central fund at a university or institute:

If you work at a university or institute that maintains a central fund to cover publication fees for Open Access publication you yourself will have to apply to the university or institute by following their guidelines. B: Researchers with support from a funding body that supports Open Access

You may already have budgeted for the publication fee when applying for the research grant in which case the publication fee has already been identified.
